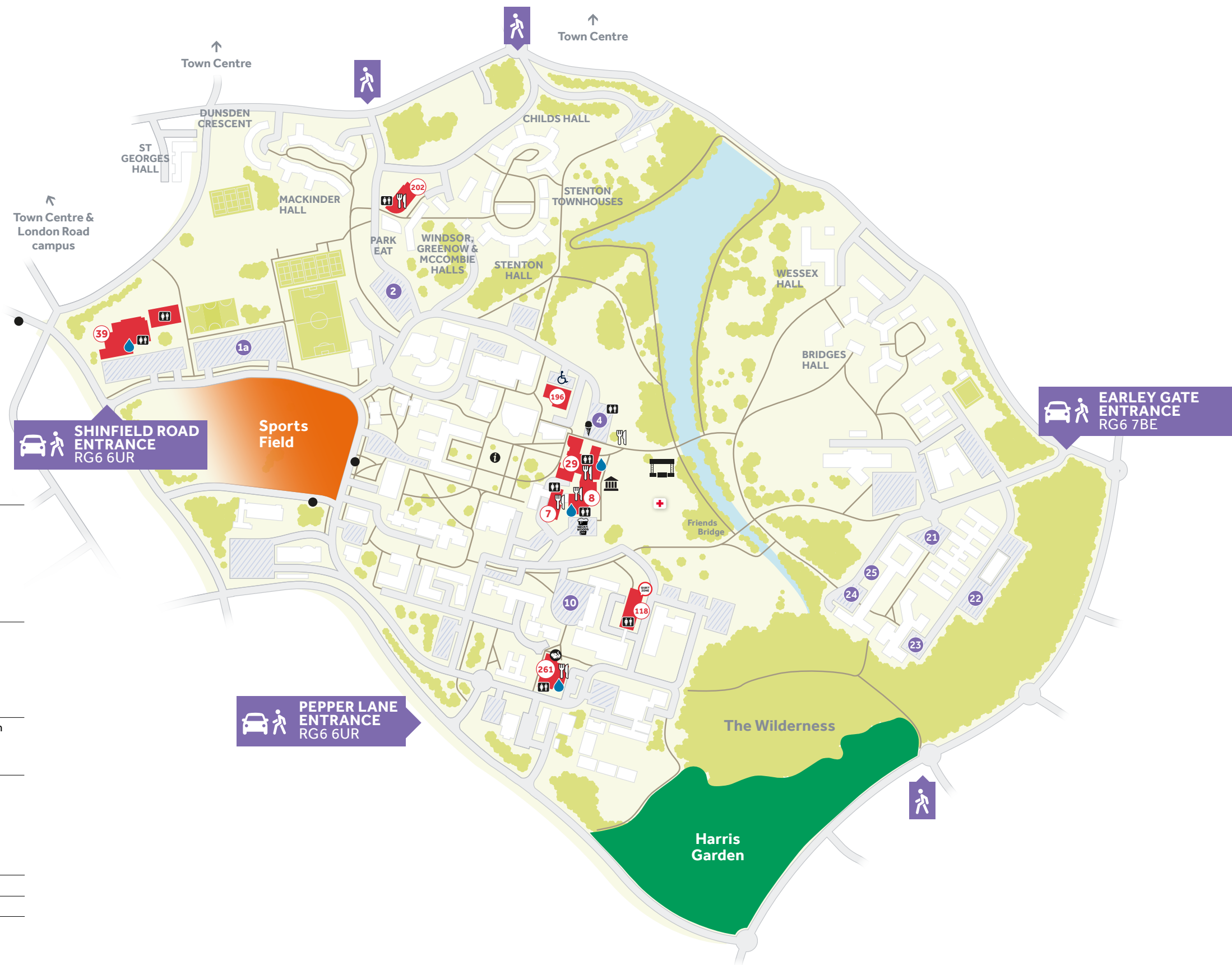

Travelling by bus

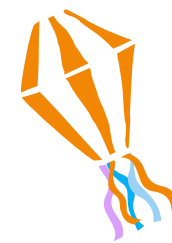
Free bus travel is available on selected routes. Registered attendees will receive a QR code to show the driver.

LOST PROPERTY

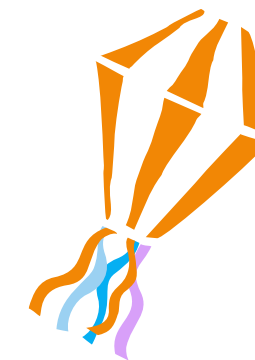
If you find any lost property or have lost an item during your visit, please go directly to the information point on the Palmer Quad where our staff will help you.

Make sure you swing by the stage on the Meadow – there is a packed lineup of exciting performances throughout the day you will not want to miss, including:



Balamuty & Zorya

🕒 12:00-12:25

Balamuty & Zorya are Ukrainian dance groups of children and adults who came to England during the Russian conflict. Based in Reading, they aim to preserve and promote Ukrainian culture, history, and art.



Kalakunj

🕒 12:30-12:50

Kalakunj presents a graceful Indian classical dance telling the timeless love story of Radha and Krishna through expressive movement, melody and rhythm, followed by a vibrant piece combining devotion to Ganesha with dynamic Carnatic patterns.



WolfNote

🕒 12:50-13:25

WolfNote are a Berkshire-based folk band whose rich mix of instruments and shared vocals create original songs that range from joyful to reflective, always full of character and heart.



The Celebration Hour

🕒 13:30-14:05

The Celebration Hour are a soulful trio mixing blues, funk and dreamy grooves into a warm, cinematic sound—think late-night drives and festival vibes, all wrapped in catchy melodies and down-to-earth charm.



The Daydream Collective

The Daydream Collective are a lively 6-piece pop/rock band with female vocals, playing crowd-pleasing covers from the last few decades—ranging from Lizzo to Fleetwood Mac—at pubs, clubs, and private events across Reading and Berkshire since 2021.



UoR Music Big Band

The Reading University Big Band is a 17-piece ensemble showcasing the University's top jazz talent, performing everything from Count Basie to Motown under the direction of Dae Hyun Lee since 2019. They celebrate the full spirit of big band music while keeping the jazz orchestra tradition alive.



The Stretch

Reading's own The Stretch burst onto the scene in 2022 with high-energy gigs, explosive melodies and a love for live music that's impossible to ignore. With a string of standout tracks like Painted Red (Wash Me Away) and a fast-growing reputation across Berkshire and beyond.



Sundaughter

Sundaughter is a four-piece, female-fronted shoegaze band from Reading, formed in 2024, with their dreamy debut single "Austrian" coming in May and plans for more releases as they make waves in the alternative music scene across Berkshire and London.

EXPLORING THE FESTIVAL



There is so much to see and do across four themed festival zones that we know something new, exciting and interesting to enjoy. Here's our guide to what you might find when you adventure through Time, Earth, Bodies and Imagination...

EARTH

Famed for our work in agriculture, food and farming, and climate and sustainability, the EARTH Zone brings you the researchers behind one of the greenest universities in the UK, plus plenty of tasty treats.

Fuel up at the International Food Market or decorate a fairy cake with Free Cakes for Kids. Then dig into the science behind the food: explore how microbes turn waste into soil, build your own microbiome, or challenge your memory with games that show how diet affects wellbeing.

A highlight of the day is the live weather balloon launch: discover how it helps measure weather patterns and even particles from space! And don't forget to visit the Atmospheric Observatory for a unique behind-the-scenes tour.

UoR Top Tip: Learn how Beans IN Toast is raising the pulse, and hoping to transform UK diets.

Reading University Atmospheric Observatory Tour

🕒 12:30, 14:00, 15:30 📍 Info Point

Join a guided tour of the University's Atmospheric Observatory to explore its instruments, learn about weather measurements, and see observation equipment up close. Tours run throughout the day and last 30–40 minutes.

Meteorological Weather Balloon Launch

🕒 13:30 & 17:00 📍 Info point

Watch a live weather balloon launch and see real-time data collected as it ascends. Learn how these balloons and their sensors help measure weather patterns, cloud droplets, volcanic ash, and even energetic particles from space.

TIME

Love history? Ready to get hands-on? Journey through the TIME Zone for family-friendly activities that explore everything from ancient artefacts to snake venom and circus skills.

Drop into the Cole Museum of Zoology to meet Norman the Asian elephant, hear talks on molluscs, and explore amazing natural history exhibits. Museums on Wheels brings the best of The MERL and Reading Museum to life with creative activities to enjoy.

Other highlights include ancient board games, Roman recycling, a chance to meet working Guide Dogs and understand visual impairment, and a playful dive into Jane Austen's childhood through dress-up and storytelling.

UoR Top Tip: Don't miss the Ure Museum of Greek Archaeology, it's perfect for curious minds of all ages.

Cole Museum

🕒 12:00–17:00 📍 Health & Life Sciences Building

Step into the fascinating world of the Cole Museum of Zoology for all things Natural History. Including talks about the history of the Cole Museum's collections and looking at some of our more famous specimens. Lastly, be sure to visit the pop-up gift shop!

BODIES

Get moving in the BODIES Zone, where sport, wellbeing and play come together in a high-energy programme for all ages and abilities.

Bounce into action in an inflatable suit on the 3G pitch or test your putting skills on the mini golf course. Try your hand at archery and pop-up tennis with Sport in Mind, inclusive touch rugby with the Berkshire Brigands, or football challenges with Berks & Bucks FA.

Prefer a slower pace? Stretch out in a yoga session or join the Kidical Mass family cycle around campus. Then get curious about healthy ageing with interactive science, including 3D faces, virtual reality, worms and even poo!

UoR Top Tip: Head to the SportsPark for rolling sports tasters, demos and drop-in sessions all day.

Kidical Mass Campus Bike Ride

Head to the Main Stage on the Meadow for live music and shows, or take part in workshops from African drumming to storytelling and craft. The ever-popular free face painting is back, alongside a campus-wide sustainability scavenger hunt – spot solar panels, bat boxes and more as you explore.

Build your own world in The Utopia Experiment, or take a creative gamble with Ostranenie! where art and adventure are shaped by the roll of a dice.
